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Volunteer Policy

1. Purpose

The Aquatic Foundation of Alaska (AFA) relies on the dedication and generosity of its families and community members.

Volunteers play a vital role in supporting meets, team events, fundraising, and day-to-day operations.

This policy outlines volunteer expectations to ensure that responsibilities are distributed fairly and that every family contributes to the success of the team.

2. Scope

This policy applies to all AFA families and adult participants in:

- Yeti Swim School
- Yeti Youth Competitive Team (Apprentice, Warrior, Gladiator, Gladiator Fit)
- Yeti Legends

Volunteer expectations apply per **family unit**, not per athlete, and are tracked annually.

3. Volunteer Hour Requirements

Annual Requirements

• **Apprentice Families:** 10 volunteer hours per season

• Warrior & Gladiator Families: 20 volunteer hours per season

Gladiator Fit Families: 10 volunteer hours per season

• Legends & Swim School Families: Encouraged but not required to volunteer at youth meets and events

Prorated Hours

Families who join **after January 1** will have their required hours **prorated to 50%** of the annual total.

This ensures fairness for families joining mid-season.

Unfulfilled Hours

- Unserved hours will be billed at **\$50 per hour** at the end of the season.
- Volunteer hours must be logged through AFA's volunteer tracking system or sign-in sheets at events.

4. Volunteer Opportunities

Volunteer roles include but are not limited to:

- Meet timers and officials
- Meet set-up and tear-down crews
- Hospitality, concessions, and check-in tables
- Fundraising or sponsorship assistance
- Team event and banquet support
- Photography, marketing, or administrative help

AFA provides training or guidance for all volunteer roles to ensure confidence and success.

5. Buyout and Substitution Options

- Families who cannot volunteer may choose to pay a buyout fee of \$50 per required hour at any point during the season.
- Families may also arrange for another approved volunteer to serve hours on their behalf.

All buyout payments are due before the final meet of the season.

6. Tracking Volunteer Hours

- Volunteer sign-ins must occur at the event location or online through AFA's tracking form.
- Hours are recorded by team staff or meet coordinators.
- Families are responsible for verifying that their hours are accurately logged.

7. Communication & Scheduling

Volunteer sign-ups are posted prior to each event via **TeamUnify** or official AFA communication channels.

- Families are expected to check postings regularly and sign up for available roles.
- If a family cannot fulfill a scheduled shift, they must notify the **Volunteer Coordinator** at least 24 hours in advance so the role can be reassigned.

8. Accountability

Failure to meet volunteer hour requirements may result in:

- The family being billed for unserved hours.
- Ineligibility to register for future sessions until the account is cleared.

This policy ensures fairness and shared responsibility within the AFA community.

9. Recognition

AFA celebrates its volunteers through team announcements, social media highlights, and special appreciation events.

Volunteers are a cornerstone of our culture — their time and energy directly fuel our athletes' success.

10. Implementation

This Volunteer Policy takes effect beginning with the **2025–2026 season** and will be reviewed annually thereafter.
